This year, the Into the Light cancer walk raised close to \$40,000. With that money we can help people of Isabella County with cancer related expenses. These expenses can become a financial burden and we are able to help ease that burden with the money we raise. There are other burdens that cancer causes that are not financial but emotional burdens.

This year, we were able to help with such a burden that made a significant difference in Alex's life. Alex is a sweet, kind young man who lost his dad to cancer in 2019. Alex was only in first grade when cancer took his hero....his dad. The past 4 years have only added to Alex's pain of losing his dad. He hasn't been able to express his feelings and feels lost.

Alex's Grandma donated to Into the Light (she is a dear friend of mine). Knowing Alex's situation, I suggested that maybe Alex, his Mom and siblings might benefit from attending our walk and creating individual luminaries for their Dad. Grandma thought that was a great idea! That night, they all showed up with beautiful luminaries that they each created with love for their dad. They placed their bags on the lighted pathway. They walked the path and were in amazement how many people had been affected by cancer as they had.

This year, we added a memorial walk for those who have lost loved ones to cancer. We also had two siblings as our speakers who had lost their mom just a year ago. Listening to them brought out emotions in Alex that he freely let go. He realized that he was not alone! He shed tears for his loss that have been held deep in his heart for a long time. That night, I was able to give a big hug to Alex and assured him that he wasn't alone. We were all there for him. I asked him if he would like to take home the luminary that he had made for his Dad. Through his pain and sorrow, I saw a smile on his face and I will never forget it. He went out to pick up his luminary, clutched it close to his heart and thanked me.

Upon talking to his Mom since the walk, she informed me that Alex turns his candle on and lights his Dad's luminary on a regular basis! It was placed on Alex's dresser where he could see it. Mom also informed me that our walk has opened Alex up and he is more willing to discuss his feelings with his counselors.

For Alex, our walk made a difference that money can't fix. For me, it was my sign that even though the walk is a lot of work and takes a great deal of time, we touch lives in so many ways not only financially, but emotionally as well and in ways we may never know. NO ONE FIGHTS ALONE!

As for me, I will continue to give all I can to make sure the Into the Light walk continues to make a difference.

TYPES AND NUMBER OF CANCERS

Breast – 21: Prostate – 9; Colon – 7; Leukemia – 5; Uterus – 5, Lymphoma – 5; Lung – 5; Brain – 3; Nasal pharynx – 2; Multiple myeloma – 2; Thyroid, Voice box, Jaw, Melanoma, Esophageal, Pancreas, and Kidney – 1 each

HOSPITALS AND NUMER OF PATIENTS IN 2022

U of M – Ann Arbor – 10 clients; Gratiot Hospital – 4 clients; My Michigan Health – 3 clients; Saginaw Covenant and Henry Ford Detroit – 2 clients each
